AVERAGE BLOOMING DATES

Our horticulturists report that the following plants are especially interesting during this time period. The location charts are in alphabetical order according to the Garden/Collection name found in the Arboretum's Visitor Guide. We invite you to discover and to enjoy these ornamental plants. Please help us preserve these important research and exhibit plants by not collecting any material, living or dead, during your visit.

Year-Round Interest

Asian Valley in the Asian Collections, Friendship Garden, National Bonsai & Penjing Museum, National Boxwood Collection, Gotelli Dwarf and Slow-Growing Conifer Collection, Knot Garden in the National Herb Garden, Morrison Garden in the Azalea Collections, Holly and Magnolia Collections

January & February

Witch-hazels, conifer foliage and cones, hollies in fruit, Japanese apricot, wintersweet, sweet-box, winter jasmine

March

2nd week: Early bulbs, winter-hazel, wintersweet, sweet-box, cornelian-cherries

3rd week: Japanese-andromeda, winter jasmine, pussy willows **4th week:** Daffodils, woodland wildflowers, flowering cherries

April

Ist week: Daffodils, crocuses, early magnolias, Korean azalea, Japanese-andromeda, forsythias, cornelian-cherries, woodland wildflowers, epimediums, flowering cherries, arisaemas

2nd week: Daffodils, crocuses, early magnolias, Korean azalea, Japanese-andromeda, forsythias, early azaleas, Oconee-bells, epimediums, flowering cherries, arisaemas

3rd week: Daffodils, magnolias, Japanese-andromeda, forsythias, Japanese-quince, early crabapples, flowering cherries, azaleas, woodland wildflowers, spring-blooming camellias, flowering cherries, redbuds, arisaemas

4th week: Magnolias, crabapples, azaleas, early rhododendrons, daffodils, Japanese-quince, arisaemas, woodland wildflowers, spring-blooming camellias, flowering cherries, lilacs, viburnums

May

1st week: Early rhododendrons, azaleas, flowering dogwoods, crabapples, late-flowering cherries, Japanese-quince, Asian magnolia, woodland wildflowers, tree peonies, lilacs, dove-tree, species roses, spring-blooming camellias

2nd week: Late azaleas, rhododendrons, sweet bay, tree peonies, tulip-tree, black locust, herbaceous peonies, woodland wildflowers, herbs, old garden roses, lilacs







3rd week: Late azaleas, rhododendrons, mountain-laurels, southern magnolias, sweet bay, Chinese dogwood, herbaceous peonies, herbs, old garden roses

4th week: Chinese dogwood, mountain-laurels, southern magnolias, sweet bay, lilies, old garden roses, herbs, herbaceous peonies, fringe-tree

Iune

1st week: Satsuki azaleas, southern magnolias, mountain-laurels, southern catalpa, fringe-tree, arrowwood viburnum, lilies, day-lilies, herbs, annuals, water-lilies, Chinese dogwood, rhododendrons, firethorn

2nd week: Mountain-laurels, linden viburnum, rosebay, goldenrain-tree, day-lilies, herbs, annuals, water-lilies

Late June to early July

Butterfly-weed, meadow and prairie flowers, water-lilies, annuals, herbs, hydrangeas

July

Water-lilies, hibiscus, crapemyrtles, conifers, daylilies, boxwood, herbs, annuals, sweet pepperbush, pepper collection, meadow and prairie wildflowers, hostas, hydrangeas

August

Water-lilies, hibiscus, crapemyrtles, conifers, boxwood, herbs, annuals, sweet pepperbush, pepper collection, meadow and prairie wildflowers, cardinal-flower, plum-leaf azalea, hostas, hydrangeas

September

Firethorn in fruit, hibiscus, viburnums in fruit, autumn crocuses, boxwood, crapemyrtles, herbs, annuals, holly osmanthus, pepper collection, hostas

Late September into early October

Meadow flowers, herbs, annuals

October

Fall foliage, firethorn in fruit, hibiscus, autumn crocuses, water-lilies, crapemyrtles, viburnums in fruit, conifer foliage and cones, dogwoods in fruit, boxwood, herbs, annuals, ornamental grasses, native witch-hazels, fall blooming camellias, toad-lilies, chrysanthemums

November

Conifer foliage and cones, dogwoods in fruit, viburnums in fruit, ornamental grasses, fall foliage, fall blooming camellias, chrysanthemums, native witchhazels

December

Hollies in fruit, heavenly-bamboo in fruit, conifer foliage and cones, Japanese apricot, wintersweet (in mild weather)
